Early Years - A Flying Start

We know that starting big school can be daunting, for parents as well as children! We aim to support your child by working closely with parents, nurseries and preschools to ensure that children have a smooth transition to reception class.

In the autumn term, we host an open evening for new starters and their families, where we go into further detail about the ins and outs of the reception year, explore the school, meet the EYFS team and play in the reception classroom. This is also a great opportunity for your child to meet their new classmates!

Our reception teacher will also visit your child in their nursery setting or at home, to introduce themselves and to begin getting to know them. They will spend time playing with your child, finding out about them and their interests and also speaking to their key worker to gather information about their learning styles and preferences.

Your child will also be invited to attend a transition morning or afternoon in July, when they can stay and play with half of their new class-mates. Parents are encouraged to leave their child once they are settled so that they can explore the environment independently.

We find that children are excited and keen to return to reception class in September, having met their new teachers, explored the lovely environment and played with their new friends.



Teaching and learning

Teaching and learning in the Early Years is play-based and child-led, just like at Preschool! Your child will already be used to playing in provision and we set up the classroom to be as similar as possible to a preschool environment at the beginning of September, in order to help with the settling in process.

Reception class is divided into areas, including role play, a comfy reading corner, sand, water, play doh, creative, maths, small construction and small world. Outside is also organised into areas, with a mud kitchen, water, large construction, role play and sand. Your child will spend much of their day playing both indoors and out, while skilled EYFS staff join them in their play, extending and challenging them when appropriate.

We also have several sessions throughout the day where we teach specific subjects. These include phonics, which we teach through the Read Write Inc program.

Enrichment

Outside the classroom, our staff provide an inclusive, high quality and extensive enrichment programme. This ensures that all pupils, regardless of their background, have access to a wide variety of opportunities.

We also recognise pupil voice through; school council, sports council, play leaders and reading volunteers. All these activities encourage pupils to engage with others, and to build transferable skills.

To further enrich our curriculum, all children are offered a broad range of visits and vistors. We make trips locally and further afield. These include museums, theatres, exhibitions, workshops farm visits, fieldwork, outdoor centres and trips to the seaside and London.



Our curriculum

Our ambitious, inclusive curriculum provides ample opportunity for all children to become confident, independent and successful learners with high aspirations, who know how to make a positive contribution to their community and the wider society. It is our aim is to prepare all children for the opportunities and challenges of the 21st Century!

We strive to provide all children with a broad and balanced curriculum. We believe wholeheartedly in supporting the development of the whole child, placing emphasis on not only academic success, but also, on each child's personal development. Keeping our children safe and supporting their mental health and well-being is at the heart of everything that we do.

Pupil Support

Our pastoral care is a strength of our caring school, ensuring that children are kept safe and are supported both inside and outside school.

Our school provides an inclusive environment for all our pupils. Our trained staff focus on creating nurturing and positive relationships with all our pupils and particularly, those with barriers to their learning. Our school's approach to learning means that our lessons both support and challenge all our pupils. Both inside and outside of lessons, we provide a caring environment for pupils that

means they always have an adult to speak to help them through the day. Our goal is to provide an environment for your child that means they love to come to school.

Special Educational Needs & Disabilities

We make every effort to achieve maximum inclusion of all pupils whilst meeting individual needs. We try to ensure that any special physical, emotional or intellectual needs are identified as early as possible. If necessary, professional guidance is sought from outside agencies with support from parents/carers at all stages. Our highly trained support staff focus on creating positive relationships with our pupils, ensuring that barriers to learning are removed.

Our building is fully accessible and meets all existing requirements for children and adults as per the Disability Discrimination Act 1995.

Before & After-school Clubs

Reception Admissions

Your child is eligible for a place in Reception class from September 2024, if they were born between: 1st September 2019; and 31st August 2020.

You can apply online via the Calderdale Council website from 17 November 2023 to 15 January 2024 (closing date).

Nursery Admissions

September January April

15 & 30 Hours free childcare. We offer 15 & 30 hours free childcare places for children aged 3 - 4 years old, where Parents/Carers meet eligibility criteria and we have places available.
